Peter Geigel and Christina Kaltenbrun were attendants for John and Mary Geigel's wedding.
John Geigel was a cousin of Catherine Schwoerer's mother.
John never had a middle name.
He used to sit on a rocker in the n.e. corner of the kitchen near a big black cast iron range. He worked the land, farming all his life. He also sold "cord wood" from their land. In the 1936 atlas at the library, it is recorded that they owned 200 acres in Manitowoc County. He could never find his birth certificate registered at the court house. This was very common in those days, because of transportation and the language barrier. Records were not required until 1907.
John was also a carpenter at home. He built the washstand that stood in their kitchen. He also made tables.

Note: ^{a)} Came to America with her mother, Anna, and her sister, Anna in 1892. Mary was fifteen years old. It took nine days and nine nights to get to America. They came on a steamship. Another passenger on the ship was Mr. Jacob Maresch, Mrs. Einberger's father. Mary explained the Grand dutchy of Baden (her birthplace) townlike settlement as a large circle of land and the families lived in the center. This was called a "dorf". Her mother had been corresponding with a friend who was already here in the Silver Lake area and decided to come to America. Their relatives and friends saw them off with tear filled eyes, wondering if they would ever see them again. She corresponded with folks "back home." During the time her family was growing up, she sewed all their clothes with the exception of coats. She knit all the mittens (using denim to reinforce the inside part) and all the stockings they wore. nobit Manitowoc Herald Times Saturday February 20 1960: Mrs. John Geigel, 82, of Rt 2 Reedsville died at her home about 8:30 Saturday. Funeral services will be held at 9:45 am Tuesday at Reedsville Funeral Home and at 10 am at St. Mary Catholic Church, Reedsville, the Rev. William Koutnik officiating. Burial will be in St. Mary Cemetery, Clarks Mills. Born in Germany Aug 16, 1877, daughter of the late George and Anna Stahl, Mrs. Geigel came to this country at the age os 15. She was married to John Geigel Oct 12 1897 at St. Nazianz. They farmed all their lives in the Town of Rockland. He died about 15 years ago. The deceased was a honorary member of the Christian Mothers of St Mary Church at Clarks Mills. Survivors include three sons, William of Manitowoc, Ed of Rt. 1 Reedsville, and Alphonse at home; four daughters, Monica of Rt 1 Reedsville, Mrs. Charles C Vondrachek of Reedsville and Mrs. Frank Dvorachek and Mrs. Edwin Sauer of Rt. 1, Whitelaw; two sisters, Mrs. Frank Schwab of St. Nazianz and Mrs. Sylvia Mertens of Milwaukee; 27 grandchildren and eight great grandchildren. A sister, Mrs. Kaltenbrun of St. Nazianz, preceded her in death in January. Friends may call at the funeral home after 2 pm Monday where the rosary will be recited at 8 pm.
